Standards:

Objectives:

The students will be able to identify and understand the types and features of landforms.

They will be able to cut out the landforms and paste them together in the order of lowest to highest land formation.

They will be able to color the landform with the color that corresponds with that terrain.

The students will create a flipbook displaying the various landforms.

Learning Activities:

- 1. Learn about and discuss landforms and their geographical features from the photo books.
- 2. Identify different types of landforms through colors and pictures.
- 3. Make a flipbook of the landforms using various printouts, crayons/colored pencils, and labeling them accordingly.

Assessment:


Did the students participate in the identifying and discussing the different types of landforms?
